Opening / Devotional / Reciting of Pledge

The presiding officer, Basileus Wright, called the Alpha Sigma Graduate Chapter meeting to order at 10:15 am. Soror Terrell, Chaplain, led us in prayer and this was followed by reciting the Sorority Pledge.

Roll Call / Introductions

Sorors introduced themselves to include their name, induction chapter, year inducted, office held (if applicable), and what you're excited about as we welcome in the Spring.

Adoption of Agenda /Reading of Minutes (Silently)

Basileus Wright called to adopt the agenda, with modifications. There are some adjustments to the agenda because some reports were not submitted. Motion was made to adopt the agenda with the modifications. The motion was dully passed.

Basileus Wright call for approval of the February 2019 meeting minutes. Soror Kathy Jones asked that we clarify the deadline for donation items/money for Soror Shabazz and that a follow up e-mail be sent to the Chapter with additional details. After consulting with Soror Shabazz, we agree to provide this clarification in an e-mail when the March 2019 minutes are submitted.

Basileus Wright again called for approval of the minutes. Soror Shabazz made a motion that the February 2019 March Minutes be approved with adjustments. Soror Joshua seconded and the motion dully passed.

Officer Reports

Basileus (Composite pg. 2)

Basileus Wright highlighted that the Educators Panel has been rescheduled to April 13, from 12:30 pm – 2:30 pm, The Blackout Masquerade hosted by lota Xi Sigma Chapter on April 27, from 7:22 pm – 12 am. Please note the upcoming Chapter Meeting Dates and Save the Dates.

Soror Leila Darden has been appointed as the 2019 Founders Chair. She will begin to report out for this role at the April Chapter meeting.

Alpha Sigma was recognized at the Central Region Conference for top fundraising for the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital Fundraising Event. A follow up question was asked about what other awards recommendations Basileus Wright submitted on behalf of Alpha Sigma. Basileus Wright indicated that she applied for any of the National Projects, to include service hours, and she also nominated Soror Yelder for Advisor of the Year.

Soror Ligon shared a sincere "thank you" for attending the Ruby Ceremony at the Central Region Conference. "It meant a lot to have you there to support me." She also went on to share that she was disappointed that Alpha Sigma was not captured in the Souvenir Book.

Basileus Wright accepted responsibility for not ensuring that Alpha Sigma was appropriately captured in the Souvenir Book, which was a monumental event. She acknowledged that she and Soror Greer discussed getting an ad for the Central Region Conference Souvenir Booklet, but the follow up did not occur and she sincerely apologizes.

Anti-Basileus (Composite pgs. 3 - 5)

Soror Amos shared special Poodle Shout Outs to all Sorors that participated in interviews on March 4th – 5th.

Welcome back to the Sisterhood Soror Daphane Williams!

Congratulations on our milestones, we're at an 85.84% retention rate and we've grown by 2.65%. Our Spring 2019 Aspirants are captured in the Composite. They will soon be Candidates later today after the Affirmation Ceremony and Rhoyal Tea. We started with 20 Aspirants, but two Aspirants removed themselves from the process due to personal reasons, but they remain very interested in Sigma Gamma Rho. More than 32 Sorors completed the Mentor Training Webinar - - thank you! We will complete another webinar in the new Sorority year. For the 16 Sorors that completed the webinar, they will receive a certificate of completion once they have successfully completed the knowledge quiz.

We did receive the membership development grant for \$800. Our goal is to create a reclamation event outside of our annual Round Up event. Plan to highlight this as a *Sigma Homecoming*!

Soror Kathy Jones asked what time the New Member Presentation will begin. Soror Amos made a date correction, it should be listed as Friday, April 26th, beginning at 7:22 pm.

Congratulations to Soror Long for recently receiving a certificate at the Central Region Conference for earning and maintaining a GPA of 3.0 or higher. We are so proud of her. She will be graduating in May and will be staying in Indy for at least two years.

Soror Williams provided feedback that Kat did an exceptional job yesterday. Congratulations!

4th Anti-Basileus – Mu (Composite pg. 13)

Soror Williams provided the Mu Chapter report on behalf of Soror Yelder. Congratulations to the Spring Mu Chapter Inductees. Please note that their new member presentation will be held on March 30th 7:22 pm at Ball Gym.

There are NO graduating seniors this May, so they will enter Fall 2019 with 8 Sorors and they are planning to have another T.O.R.C.H. class.

Sorors were asked to review the Composite for upcoming Mu Chapter events and make every effort to be supportive.

5th Anti-Basileus – Gamma Zeta (Composite pg. 14)

Basileus Wright provided an update on Gamma Zeta. The hearing panel found sufficient evidence to declare allegations of hazing were fully founded and credible. Refer to the Composite for more details about those involved and the results of the formal hearing. There are specific directives in place to include Gamma Zeta remaining under a cease and desist until the Region can confirm they have complied with all directives from the formal hearing.

Anti-Grammateus (Composite pg. 15)

Soror Sarratt provided project updates on the Chapter Directory and Sorority Name Badges. The next round of updates for the Chapter Directory will be requested this week, as well as the next order for the Sorority Name Badges. Payment for the Name Badges will be submitted this week and the proofs will be provided for review/approval.

Soror Sarratt encouraged Sorors to please read the Alpha Sigma weekly newsletter, when published. The metrics suggest that the click /open rates for the newsletter are low. This is the best method we have for keeping Sorors informed.

Finally, Soror Sarratt asked that Sorors be mindful that when they sign up for events, please make every effort to keep your commitments. Specifically for the Affirmation Ceremony and Rhoyal Tea today, more than 10-12 Sorors have cancelled at the last minute. We spend money and plan events based on the RSVPs we receive, we're counting on everyone to do what they can to keep their commitments.

Grammateus (Composite pgs. 16 - 36)

Soror Clayton shared that she has provided three separate reports for the Chapter to review.

Payment plan options for Sorority year 2019-2020 are already set up and available. For returning Sorors, the March payment is \$108.50 and for Life Members, the March payment is \$71. These payments would continue until the payment plan concludes in June 2019. Soror Clayton is already tracking assessments being paid for 2019-2020 Sorority year in a separate financial report.

Sorors are being asked to *"Make the pledge and donate to Alpha Sigma through Time and Service"!* Every Soror is being asked to pledge to select and commit to one service day at the Racetrack. Save the dates for May 11th, 19th, 24th, 25th and 26th. Sunday, May 26th is a critical date and we need a minimum of 15 volunteers to sign-up. This shift will run from 4 am – 2 pm on this date.

Become a member of the *exclusive Raceway Poodle Club* and receive a commemorative gift, which will be announced later! You will also be entered in a raffle for a variety of prizes as follows:

- 1 entry per service date completed
- 1 entry for every non-Soror you pledge (sign up and service completion)

Sorors can also donate \$90 or \$100 to help support Chapter programming, scholarship, and youth engagement, centennial planning, and potentially bringing back the CCC Float!

Soror Norman stated that it is disappointing to see that our Scholarship amounts have been reduced. She encouraged Sorors to engage with the Speedway to help us "get this money" so that we don't have to raise dues. If you can do the Speedway volunteerism, you can pledge a time or money. Soror Norman challenged Sorors to step up.

Soror Clayton provided the Tamiochus report on behalf of Soror Clark. The Chapter had a February ending balance of \$36,195.89 vs. a March ending balance of \$36,666.54.

Basileus Wright again apologized for the error as well.

Parliamentarian (Composite pg. 44)

Soror Jones provided "Poodle Praises" to the AS Chapter Delegates for reviewing the final dispositions for the region in advance of the Central Region Conference.

Soror Jones shared that when she was Basileus, she gifted a Gavel to the Chapter, but we lost track of it over time. The goal was for the gavel to pass from Basileus to Basileus each Sorority year. She purchased and donated a new gavel for the Chapter. In addition, she also gifted a "block" to compliment the gavel. The block actually reflects the name of the current Basileus and the hope is that we will be able to maintain this practice going forward.

Soror Mattox expressed her disappointed to see an announcement come out that we're planning Community Service on the same weekend that we'll be hosting the Rhoer Regional Conference. She further expressed her hurt and disappointment that the Chapter doesn't support our girls. For the Sorors that have volunteered already, thank you. These girls need to see more support from our Chapter.

Basileus Wright asked Soror Mattox if she had reached out to Soror Anderson to discuss the conflict and Soror Mattox shared that she just read the information last night, so no she did not reach out. Basileus Wright indicated that we will resolve this conflict after the meeting today and the service date will be adjusted so that we do not have a conflict.

Soror Norman asked if we have a way to do fundraising for the Rhoers. Soror Mattox clarified that Sorors can send monetary donations for our Rhoers via PayPal, with a note indicating the donation is for the Rhoers. Soror Mattox also confirmed that she's asking for donations for two graduating seniors.

Soror Shabazz spoke on behalf of the Regional to echo the points that Soror Mattox made about the importance of supporting our Rhoers. We have more than 100 Rhoers that have registered and we need to show up to support our Rhoers.

Chaplain (Composite pg. 47)

Soror Terrell thanked Sorors that are reading the inspirational comments. Details are in the Composite about the upcoming prayer call on Mon., March 25 at 7:22 pm.

Soror Doretha Nance continues to recover from a stroke. Praise God she is being moved out of her rehabilitations center to her home. Continue to keep her in our prayers. Please keep these Sorors in your prayers for their personal situations as well: 1) Soror Cox shared they've had a recent death and are planning a funeral, 2) Soror Turner shared that her only sibling has been placed in hospice, and 3) Soror Anderson also had a family member pass away, which is why she wasn't at the meeting.

Youth Symposium (Composite pgs. 53 - 58)

Basileus Wright provided the update on the Youth Symposium that was held on Sat., March 9. Alpha Sigma joined SGRho chapters nationwide to host this event and the discussion centered on human trafficking and how youth, parents, and guardians can protect themselves and others from becoming victims.

Basileus Wright shared that more than 40 Sorors had registered for this event, but did not attend. We need to be mindful of the commitments that we make to attend events.

Soror Williams shared a personal observation that she learned that this isn't something that happens immediately, but instead it typically occurs over a period of 6 months to a year for these relationships to be cultivated. This was very informative and a good job done by all involved.

Basileus Wright stated that this was a challenging topic. She also shared that we don't currently have a National Projects Chair, so in the interim, she will continue to lead these efforts. Project Cradle Care and the Water Safety class will be the next focus areas. She plans to reach out to Soror Maggie Lewis to see if she has an interest in partnering with the Girls and Boys Club on the Water Safety class, which will focus outside the pool.

Soror Kathy Jones shared that during the parent session, she learned that 40% of the kids that get pulled into human trafficking get lured away by family members.

Soror Riley shared that she will provide a detailed report at the April Chapter meeting focused on the Centennial. Soror Cox shared that through her Teach Plus platform, she's had the opportunity to be a guest speaker for the Senate on several occasions recently. This platform allows her to be an advocate for teachers and she always represents Sigma inher Royal Blue attire!
